**The CornerStone Food Program** was first started in 2000 with nine families. In 2001, about 70 families came each week to pick up a bag of food.

Today, 'The CornerStone Food Program' provides supplemental food to about 450 families each month. Food is gleaned each day from local stores, donated by churches, individuals and others.

- Each family receives a bag with bread, produce and meat every week.
- Families that qualify based on income receive TEFAP commodities.
- Seniors who qualify are placed in the CSFP program.
- Children who qualify receive a backpack with enough food for breakfast, lunch and dinner for the weekend.

- ❖ **USDA distribution to WestPoint:** Second Wednesdays.
- ❖ **USDA & CSFP distribution to Doswell:** Second & Fourth Wednesdays.
- ❖ **Mobile Pantry:** First Wednesday, every other month.

**The Lily Field Clothing Shed** was started in 2001. Donated clothing and household items are sorted and made available to families.

**The CornerStone Free Health Clinic** is a medical home to those uninsured. Professional dental care and medical services were started in 2002. For a couple of years, patients were taken to CrossOver Clinic in

Richmond for extractions and fillings. A Vision Clinic was added on in 2004.

**In 2018,**

41 medical, dental and vision clinics were scheduled. 17 patients received dentures/partials, 1648 prescriptions were filled valued at over \$250,000. An average of 44 patients received free medication every month. 43 prescription glasses were provided to patients.

Food was distributed on an average of 15 times each month. About 450 families (18,024 households comprising 60,164 individuals). in King William, King & Queen, Essex & Doswell received food at each distribution.

Nearly 360,000 pounds of food distributed to families in 2018 was donated locally.

All services are free of cost to clients and patients.
